- 4. Has fear caused you to trim the truth, avoid issues, or excuse someone's sin rather than confront him/her?
- 5. Where have you tended to personalize things that are not personal and in so doing miss God-given opportunities to speak redemptively?
- 6. What difficulty in your life is giving you an opportunity to do Great Commission work?
